

Most Commonly Asked Questions

Question: Can I attend more than one summer camp?

Answer: Of course. Our coaching staff understands that some camps will overlap and we encourage all students to try multiple activities. We do ask that you communicate with the head coach or camp director and alert him/her to the situation.

Question: Do summer camps cost money?

Answer: Yes, each camp has fees associated with it. They will vary depending on the length of the camp, costs of insurance, number of instructors and other factors.

Question: Are summer camps mandatory?

Answer: No. Students who choose not to attend summer camp(s) are not penalized or prohibited from trying out during the posted tryout period; however camps are highly recommended and advantageous to the athlete. In addition, some camps will evaluate players to help determine placement on a team.

Question: Do I have to attend summer school and what if the camp conflicts with summer school?

Answer: If you have a core reading or math score below the allowable minimum then you may not participate in a summer camp that conflicts with summer school.

Question: Does the sport count for physical education credit?

Yes. Any athletic team sport will count toward your required 20 PE credits. Also, once you've fulfilled your physical education requirement team sports can be applied toward your elective credit requirement.

Question: Is there a cost to play a high school sport?

Answer: No, we do not require a participation fee. Each program however will ask for donations to help support the program. These donations can be monetary or in the form of donated time, effort or assistance with events. In addition, each team member will be offered the opportunity to purchase a "spirit pack" that will consist of any number of the following items: shirt(s), shorts, sweat, shoes, etc. Spirit Pack items are the athlete's to keep. Students will also be asked to fundraise in an effort to support the program. Fundraising monies traditionally are applied to additional coaches, new equipment, additional tournaments and facility improvements.

Question: Do I have to have a physical to play a sport?

Answer: Yes, all students that wish to tryout or participate in a team sport must have completed an athletic clearance packet. Included in this packet is the physical exam form along with proof of insurance, consent to treat in event of an emergency and CUSD code of conduct.
